



Peter won a Gold and a Silver. The legend, China, won 9 Gold medals, including 800 Backstroke at the amazing age of almost 94. Peter Sheean also swam very well winning 2 Gold, 3 Bronze as well as 2 Bronze in the relays.

Jenny Doak also competed in Outrigging and won 1 Gold, 2 Silver and a Bronze.

At the Indoor Rowing at Pan Pacs the members of the Sunshine Coast Indoor Rowing Club won a total of 55 medals, including 32 Gold. That is a brilliant achievement.

There were some comments made at Pan Pacs, that Indoor Rowing is a relatively new sport. That is not correct. I, Wendy Coghill, first competed in Indoor Rowing at the Australian Masters Games in Newcastle in 2001. I have since then competed in numerous AMG, Pan Pacs, QLD Championships, NZ Masters Games and Australian Championships. Indoor Rowing was certainly a sport in Australia in the 1990s and has been very popular in Europe and the USA for a long time.
