The trophies were sponsored by Jarrod Bleijie, the State Member for Kawana.



Vince Home

VINCE HOME was born on the 2nd May, 1925 in Condamine, QLD. He was the youngest of 4 children. His parents, William and May, managed a cattle property. Vince lived a typical bush kid's life with home schooling, milking cows morning and night, carrying water from the creek to the house and vegie garden. He learnt to drive at age 6 and got his first shoes at 8.

Vince left school in 1939 at age 14, when World War 2 started. He worked for a butcher. Then he worked in a garage and a sawmill in Chinchilla. He drove trucks in Tara.

Vince was an excellent sportsman. He played tennis, golf, cricket and rugby. He met Beryl in Tara. They were married in 1950, 71 years ago. Vince became a station manager on a sheep station. Then Vince and Beryl ran a very successful grocery store in Tara.



In 1958 Vince and Beryl gave up the country lifestyle they loved and moved to Brisbane to give their kids an education and a better chance in life. The Home family lived in Wynnum, Manly and then in Alexandra Hills, which is still the family home.

Vince and Beryl have 4 children, Larry, Susan, Dianne and Donald. They have 10 grandchildren and 10 plus 2 great grandchildren.

Vince was also a very keen fisherman and taught all his kids to fish.

In Brisbane Vince had a number of different jobs and eventually rose to be a Senior executive with David Jones, QLD. He also had senior roles in the real estate industry.

Vince and Beryl started travelling in 1980 and did the full lap of Australia in 1981. They did fruit picking in Victoria and also worked as cook assistants for the Army Reserve in WA.

Vince loved woodwork. He was also a great practical joker. In 1982 Vince was a volunteer at the Commonwealth Games in Brisbane.

Vince started to lose his sight in the 1990s and handed in his driver's licence at age 70 in 1995.



It was dangerous to go walking. Yet, he continued to do so. Vince and Beryl also continued their travelling around Australia with Beryl driving.

Vince had major blockages in several of his coronary arteries and underwent a triple bypass in 2005. In 2017 Vince had a cochlear implant. Then he had to learn to hear all over again.

Vince, Beryl and some family members made an annual pilgrimage to Ballandean near Stanthorpe from 2011 to 2019, where Vince was able to reconnect with the land.

Larry gave Vince and Beryl a concept2 rowing machine in 2012. After 2 weeks Vince was able to row 5000 m in a single row. In another 4 months he did his first 10,000 m row. Quite an achievement for an 88 year old. His family joined him up to a global virtual rowing group called the Ancient Mariners.

Vince and Beryl entered the Indoor Rowing at the 2014 Pan Pacs at the Gold Coast and won numerous medals. They both competed in the 2015 QLD Indoor Rowing Championships and in every QLD Championships since then apart from this year.

In the 2016 Pan Pacs, Vince was in the 90+ age group. He won all his races and set a World Record in the 4 minute race with an amazing distance of 891 m. In the 2018 Pan Pacs Vince was the oldest competitor across all sports. He again won all his events.

In 2019 Vince rowed a MARATHON on his rowing machine. His time for the 42.19 km / 42,195 m was 4 hours 32.57 minutes. He set 2 World Records. This was probably Vince's most amazing feat in the sport of Indoor Rowing. He was an absolute legend and was adored by competitors of all ages and abilities. He was always very modest about his achievements. He was the ultimate gentleman.

Vince passed away on Saturday, 4th September, 2021 after a short illness.
